## arapahoe/douglas mental health network



Arapahoe/Douglas Mental Health Network provides professional, culturally inclusive mental health and substance abuse services. It offers outpatient services such as individual, family, marital, and group counseling therapies, plus a full range of group and inpatient programs.

Founded in 1955 as Arapahoe Mental Health Center, it became a Comprehensive Community Mental Health Center as a result of legislation on July 1, 1967. In 2000, Arapahoe Mental Health Center implemented the doing/business/as name of Arapahoe/Douglas Mental Health Network (ADMHN).

Today ADMHN is responsible for mental health programs serving residents of Arapahoe County (not including the City of Aurora) and Douglas County. Some programs are open to residents outside this area, including substance abuse treatment programs as well as the insurance-only Turning Points Counseling and Psychiatric Practice.

Arapahoe/Douglas Mental Health Center collaborates with community organizations to help further their mission of caring for our community. They work with human service agencies, school districts, police departments, corrections agencies, probation departments, youth detention centers, juvenile centers, hospitals, health departments, medical facilities, mental health centers, substance abuse treatment facilities, nursing homes, senior centers, and the cities of Castle Rock, Centennial, Englewood, Littleton, Lone Tree, Parker, and Sheridan.

Through a \$6.5 million CHFA Nonprofit loan, Arapahoe/Douglas Mental Health Network was able to acquire and renovate a commercial building that consolidates all administrative functions into a single location in Englewood.
