this week: neuro-inclusive housing white paper

CHFA's work is guided by its vision that everyone in Colorado will have the opportunity for housing stability and economic prosperity. Coloradans living with an Intellectual and/or Developmental Disability (I/DD) often face significant barriers to housing access and long-term housing stability.

To explore the housing needs and related resources in Colorado for residents with I/DD, CHFA commissioned the Neuro-inclusive Housing White Paper. Published in 2022, the paper includes the results of more than two years of interviews, surveys, and research. It provides background information about the history of residential options for individuals with I/DD as well as an overview of current barriers, unique considerations, and resources available to both individuals and housing developers.
